3. ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF TERRITORY

Davies acknowledged the traditional territory of the Coast Salish peoples.

4. CONSIDERATION OF BYLAW AMENDMENTS

Executive Director Steven Beasley made a short presentation on changes to the Society Act, and reported on the process of transition to the new Act. He said that the Representative Committee had begun the process of transitioning, and that they Bylaw amendments, if passed, would be registered as part of the transition process.

Davies announced that each resolution required 75% majority support and would only be deemed passed if that threshold was met.

4.1 Proposal to Amend Bylaw I, Definitions

Gordon/Pesklevits

Whereas the BC Society Act has been replaced with a new Societies Act, and these changed included a change in the definition of Special Resolution;

Whereas the use of the word "union" to represent a students' union is confusing because the students' union is not a labour union, and the term union is more commonly meant to refer to a labour union;

Whereas the Canadian Federation of Students-BC has changed its name and is seeking to sever ties with Canadian Federation of Students: therefore

Be it resolved that Bylaw I, Article 2 be amended to read as follows:

"2. "Students' Union" shall mean the Society of the Douglas Students' Union."

Be it resolved that Bylaw I, Article 4 be amended to read as follows:

"4. "Federation" shall mean the British Columbia Federation of Students and "CFS" shall mean the Canadian Federation of Students/Canadian Federation of Students-Services."

Be it resolved that Bylaw I, Article 5 be amended to read as follows:

"5. "Special Resolution" shall mean a special resolution as defined by the Societies

Act "

External Relations Coordinator Surya Viswanathan provided background on the purpose of the proposed changes.

4.2 Proposal to Amend Bylaw III, Fees

2017/02/02:04 MOTION

Mazurek/Gordon

Whereas the requirement for a petition of 10% of the membership in order to lower a service fee appears a barrier to democratic participation;

Whereas the Bylaw III, Article 2. B. is redundant;

Whereas the expression of a combined fee for the Building, Clubs and Performing Arts fund limits the independent adjustment of those fees;

Whereas the fee collected for the health and dental plan is currently in excess of the level needed to cover the cost of the current benefits; and

Whereas Bylaw III, Article 8, A is redundant: therefore

Be it resolved that Bylaw III, Article 2 be deleted;

Be it further resolved that Bylaw III. Article 3 be amended to read as follows:

"3. Fees

The fees shall consist of:

- a. a general programs and services fee of not less than \$37.00 per student per semester, pro-rated for part-time students;
- b. a club fee of not less than \$1.17 per student per semester;
- c. a building fee of not less than \$1.17 per student per semester; and

d. a performing arts fee of not less than \$1.17 per student per semester."

Be it further resolved that Bylaw III, Article 6 be amended to read:

"6. Health and Dental Plan Fee

The Students' Union shall collect a Health and Dental Plan fee of not less than \$250.00 per eligible student."

Be it further resolved that Bylaw III, Article 8 be amended to read:

"8. Funds

Should the Performing Arts Fund and the Clubs Fund reach a balance of \$100,000 each, the surplus from each fund will be transferred to general revenue."

Treasurer Aran Armutlu described the proposed changes and their purpose.

4.3 Proposal to Amend Bylaw V, Federation Meetings

Whereas the Canadian Federation of Students-BC has changed its name and is seeking to sever ties with Canadian Federation of Students; and

Whereas these changes just amend the organization names and phrasing of this Bylaw, and do not edit the meaning of the Bylaw;

Whereas these changes are needed to make Bylaw V congruent with the other changes proposed to Bylaw I: therefore

Be it resolved that Bylaw V be amended to read as follows:

FEDERATION AND CFS GENERAL MEETINGS

1. CFS General Meeting Delegation

The Students' Union will have a maximum of four (4) delegates at all CFS General Meetings.

2. Federation General Meeting Delegation

The Students' Union will have a maximum of six (6) delegates at all Federation General Meetings.

Pride Representative Tanysha Klassen outlined the purpose of the proposed changes to Bylaw V.

4.4 Proposal to Delete Bylaw VI, Article 1

Whereas the Societies Act of BC specifies that non-profit societies are overseen by an elected board of directors;

Whereas the title "director" thereby indicates the role of a director in relation to the oversight of a society;

Whereas the board of directors of the Douglas Students' Union is titled Representative Committee, a name which does not adequately describe the role of the body;

Whereas the title 'board of directors' provides increased transparency as it indicates the proper legal role of the members elected to serve in that role: therefore

Be it resolved that Bylaw VI, Article 1 be deleted;

Be it resolved that the remaining articles in Bylaw VI be renumbered accordingly; and Be it further resolved that all references to the "Representative Committee" be replaced with "Board of Directors" throughout the bylaws.

Beasley spoke about the role of the Board of Directors and the benefits of using the proper term in place of the existing title of Representative Committee.

4.5 Proposal to Amend Bylaws VI and IX, Representative Committee Member Titles and job Descriptions

Whereas the existing structure for the Executive Officer members of the Representative Committee has a pronounced focus on internal affairs;

Whereas students' unions of Douglas' size have an executive balanced between the main functions of services, advocacy and events;

Whereas members in the past several years have sought an increased focus on event organizing and improved campus life;

Whereas the existing job descriptions for members of the Representative Committee provide neither appropriate direction on what elected directors should do, nor any ability for members to hold elected directors accountable for not doing their jobs; therefore:

Be it resolved that Bylaw VI, Article 2., Subsections A. and B. be amended to read:

- "a. Executive Members, comprised of the following:
 - i. Director of External Relations
 - ii. Director of Finance
 - iii. Director of College Relations
 - iv. Director of Campus Life
 - v. Coquitlam Campus Director."
- b. Three (3) Directors at Large

Be it further resolved that Bylaw IX, Articles 1 through 6 be amended to read:

"1. Director of External Relations

The Director of External Relations shall:

- a. be responsible for keeping the Representative Committee informed of issues arising off campus which pertain to the activities of the Students' Union;
- jointly with other members of the Representative Committee and staff, articulate the Students' Union's policies and positions on various issues to members, coalition partners, other organizations, government representatives and the media;
- c. act as a liaison between the Union and external organizations;
- d. oversee and help coordinate the campaigns work of the Students' Union;
- e. jointly with the Provincial Executive Representative, ensure local implementation of Federation campaigns;

- f. assist Constituency Representative members of the Representative Committee with advocacy work related to their respective portfolios;
- g. assist with government relations work of the Students' Union; and
- h. shall perform other duties as assigned by the Representative Committee.

2. Director of Campus Life

The Director of Campus Life shall:

- a. oversee the coordination of all Students' Union events, including but not limited to:
 - i. annual September welcome back events;
 - ii. annual January welcome back events;
 - iii. stress-buster and end-of-semester events;
 - iv. pub nights and evening social events;
 - v. regular information tabling events;
 - vi. regular events to promote Students' Union membership;
 - vii. summer events;
 - viii. such other regular events that the Students' Union may be developed;
- b. represent the Students' Union in the coordination of participation in, and sponsorship of, College events, including but not limited to:
 - i. EDGE;
 - ii. Welcome Weeks;
 - iii. International Student Orientation;
 - iv. New Student Orientation;
 - v. Mature Student Orientation; and
 - vi. such other College events that may be developed;
- c. oversee creation of an annual event plan for presentation and adoption by the Board of Directors prior to August 1 of each year;
- d. ensure that the Students' Union's contribution to campus events is duly recognized through event materials and publication;
- e. oversee the recruitment, coordination and recognition of Students' Union volunteers; and
- f. perform other duties as assigned by the Representative Committee.

3. Director of Finance

The Director of Finance shall

- a. shall assist in formulating a budget for the Union;
- b. shall insure that careful account is kept of all monies received and disbursed by the Students' Union;
- c. shall be responsible for keeping the Representative Committee informed of all issues which pertain to the finances of the Union;
- d. ensure that an accurate inventory or all assets of the Students' Union is kept;
- e. ensure timely production of the annual audit financial statements and auditor's report;

- f. ensure the responsible management of the finances of the Students' Union, including long-term financial planning and the production of regular financial reporting to the Board of Directors per policy;
- g. oversee the operations of the Students' Union's office and building spaces, and ensure that programs and services operate in a responsible and costeffective manner;
- h. oversee the maintenance of the records of the Students' Union, and ensure that accurate records are kept of all Board, General and other meetings;
- oversee and help coordinate the operations of the Students' Union club system;
- j. oversee distribution of funds in the Performing Arts Fund upon recommendation for the appropriate Students' Union Committee; and
- k. perform other duties as assigned by the Representative Committee.

4. Director of College Relations

The Director of College Relations shall:

- be responsible for keeping the Representative Committee informed of issues arising within the College which pertain to the activities of the Students' Union or the well-being of students;
- b. coordinate Union representation on all College committees;
- c. ensure that the Students' Union's positions are articulated to the College's Education Council, Board of Governors, Senior Management team and appropriate sub-committees thereof;
- d. assist in supporting the Students' Union's ombudsperson service, and ensure that student appeal committee positions are appropriately filled at all times;
- e. ensure that the Board of Directors is appropriately informed of academic governance and post-secondary education governance issues occurring provincially, nationally and globally that could affect the education delivered at Douglas College;
- f. assist with the implementation and operation of membership awareness initiatives of the Students' Union;
- g. assist with the preparation for annual general meetings, special general meetings and other membership participation elements of the Students' Union;
- h. assist with the preparation of Students' Union membership publications; and
- i. shall perform other duties as assigned by the Representative Committee.

5. Coquitlam Campus Director

The Coquitlam Campus Director shall:

- Represent the interests, needs and concerns of Coquitlam members to the Representative Committee;
- b. assist with the coordination and implementation of Students' Union events and activities at the Coquitlam Campus;

- c. jointly with the Director of External Relations, implement Students' Union and Federation campaigns at the Coquitlam Campus;
- assist the Director of College Relations with the implementation and operation of membership awareness initiatives of the Students' Union at the Coquitlam Campus;
- e. oversee the recruitment and coordination of Students' Union volunteers at the Coquitlam Campus;
- f. Jointly with the Director of Finance, oversee the provision of Students' Union services and programs, and the operation of the Students' Union spaces on the Coquitlam Campus; and
- g. perform other duties as assigned by the Representative Committee.

6. Directors at Large

The Directors at Large shall:

- a. assist the Executive Officers in fulfilling their duties;
- b. sit on at least two (2) committees; and
- c. perform other duties as assigned by the Representative Committee."

David Lam Coordinator Meredith Graham and Internal Relations Coordinator Jerzy Mazurek discussed the purpose of the changes to the Executive Officer titles and job descriptions. They spoke about the need to better define job descriptions that both outline the work to be done, and hold elected members accountable for doing that work.

4.6 Proposal to Amend Bylaw X, Portfolio Positions

2017/02/02:08 MOTION

Megarief/Agbaje

Whereas the portfolios related to the clubs and performing arts funds are better assigned to Executive Officer members of the Representative Committee who work more regular hours;

Whereas the term chairperson is more descriptive than speaker in describing the role of meeting facilitator, and that having a deputy or backup chairperson is a positive practice; and

Whereas the language of Bylaw X was in need of modernization and updating: therefore:

Be it resolved that Bylaw X, Article 3 be amended to read:

"3. Staff Relations Officer

The Staff Relations Officer shall represent the employer in dealings with the staff union, and in the execution of the employer's management rights. The Staff Relations Officer shall also fulfill any other labour relations or management responsibility assigned by the Representative Committee directly or via policy."

Be it resolved that Bylaw X, Article 4 be amended to read:

"4. Chairperson and Deputy Chairperson

The Chairperson shall facilitate meetings of the Representative Committee and assist in the preparation of meeting agendas. The Chairperson shall ensure timely preparation and distribution of the meeting minutes. The Deputy Chairperson shall

facilitate meetings of the Representative Committee when the Chairperson is unable to attend a meeting."

Be it resolved that Bylaw X, Article 5 be amended to read:

"5. Federation Executive Representative

The Federation Executive Representative shall be appointed to fulfill the role of Local 6 Members' Representative on the Executive Committee of the BC Federation of Students, and shall:

- a. attend all Federation and CFS general meetings;
- b. regularly report to the Representative Committee about the services, campaigns and internal affairs of the Federation and CFS; and
- c. ensure that all reports and other materials from each Federation Executive Committee meeting, and each Federation and CFS general meeting are made available to the Representative Committee."

Be it resolved that Bylaw X, Articles 6 and 7 be deleted.

Graham and Mazurek outlined the purpose of the proposed amendments, and noted that this resolution had the same intention as the previous one just adopted by members.

4.7 Proposal to Amend Bylaw XIV, Finances

Whereas the Society has signing officers who are in charge of executing payments and contracts:

Whereas this responsibility should be assigned based on experience, knowledge, availability and diligence;

Whereas currently the Society designates signing officers by position;

Whereas the current bylaw does not provide an ability to remove someone as a signing officer should they engage in misconduct; therefore

Be it resolved that Bylaw XIV, Article 1. A. be amended to read:

"a. The signing officers of the Society shall be appointed by the Representative Committee and shall include not less than two (2) and not more than four (4) members of the Representative Committee, and not less than one (1) and not more than two (2) staff persons."

Beasley described the mechanisms to hold signing officers accountable and said that the purpose of the amendment was to ensure that the Students' Union had access to those mechanisms.

He highlighted elements of the Statement of Financial Position and Statement of Operations. He said that the Auditor's Report expressed confidence in the statements as presented.
